About David Schumann—Artist, Illustrator, Author, Musician, Songwriter, Photographer



A modern-day renaissance man and life-long creative, David Schumann is now turning his energies to writing and illustrating delightful children's books. His style is to illustrate his rhyming stories with whimsical pictures and hand-drawn letters that are equally as original and charming. His animals in *A Party for the Moon*, are clever and cool musicians; his birds in *Eleven Crows*, are funny and fanciful as they fly from page to page.

David says he lived an idyllic childhood roaming the woods and streams of rural New Jersey photographing and sketching wildlife and landscapes. He came of age in the 1970s hitchhiking through the US and Canada on adventures that took him to California and finally brought him to New Mexico where he met his artist wife, Tina, of fifty plus years. He and Tina and their two children lived a pioneer lifestyle on the edge of a national forest raising chickens, goats, and running with the horses.

Along the way, he taught himself how to play the guitar, paint, write songs, become a fine artist, and to create award-winning murals. Today, David can often be seen performing with his band, "Odd Dog" where he is lead singer, guitarist, and songwriter. With the band, he has recorded three albums of original music. David and Tina now share a home in the Sandia Mountains with their two cats and dog, "Roux." His 3 great-grandchildren continue to inspire his children's books.
